

was a fine soldier, and was much liked by all who knew him.

Colonel James Farquharson Macleod died at Calgary, North-West Canada, on September 5. A member of the Canadian Bar, he interested himself in the Volunteer movement, and was Brigade Major of the Canadian Militia in the Red River Expedition under Lord Wolseley. For his services there he was made a Companion of the Order of St. Michael and St. George. He was subsequently Commissioner of the North-West Mounted Police, and it was largely through his influence with the Blackfoot and other tribes that the problem of the settlement of Indian treaties was so satisfactorily solved. In acknowledgment of his services, the Government called the first post in the Blackfoot country that was occupied "Fort Macleod." Colonel Macleod was from its formation a member of the North-West Council; and for the last few years was Judge of the Supreme Court, in which capacity he won the confidence and respect of all.
